

I'm going on an adventure wrap



Art Yarn Suggestion: This pattern is for 1 skein of fingering weight yarn approximately 400-430 yards of yarn. You could always use 2 if you wanted a larger wrap. I of course recommend either our hand dyed Merino silk yarns or our Luxury cotton. They are both hand painted for excellent color changes.

Needle size: size 5 or 6 needles, circular Whatever your preferred size is for fingering weight yarn

Gauge: approx 28 stitches (4 in / 10 cm)

Skills needed: cast on, increase, garter stitch, yarn over, knit together, Picot bind off (look on Youtube)

Abbreviations:

K- knit

sts-stitches

k2tog - knit two stitches together

yo - yarn over

inc - increase by knitting into the front and back of a sts

Pattern support:

I would recommend blocking your wrap. Always use cool water to wet and then lay flat to dry in the desired shape. If your yarn has very bright dyes it's





always wise to lay flat to dry on an old towel or something similar the first time you block to avoid any color transfer, just like those cool dark wash jeans. Always hand wash in cool and lay flat to dry



Let's get started

Set up Cast on 3 sts

row 1 k all sts

row 2 inc in first sts then k to the end of the row

row 3 k all the sts till you get to the last sts and then inc in the last stitch

row 4-21 repeat rows 2 and 3,

you will be making a triangle with one end that is pointed and will grow larger on that one side. By alternating between inc in the first and last sts you will be always inc in the same side forming the shape of the wrap.

row 22 - inc in the first sts , YO , k2tog repeating all the way to the end of the row

row 23 k the entire row

repeat rows 22 and 23 as you're knitting the wrap whenever you want to make a row of lacework. You can add in a row of lacework as often or as little as you would like that way every wrap is different. I do recommend always picking a row that starts with an Inc



Finishing

when you are nearing the end of your skein of yarn it's time to start your picot bind off. I recommend lookin up how to do a picot bind off on YouTube. Here is a link

Please leave a decent amount of yarn for your bind off because you will be making some extra stitches as you bind off so it takes more yarn than an average bind off.
