Providence Fingerless Gloves



Handspun Yarn

Suggestion: Approx 65 yards dk/
worsted weight

Needle size : size I crochet hook or
size you normally use for dk weight yarn

Gage: 12 -15 gauge (4 in/ 10 cm)

Size: once size fits most

Skills needed: single crochet,

double crochet, triple crochet

Abbreviations:

sc: single crochet

dc : double crochet

tp: tripple crochet

Pattern support:

I would highly recommend blocking your handspun gloves. Always use cool water to wet and then lay flat to dry in the desired shape. If your



yarn has very bright dyes it's always wise to lay flat to dry on an old towel or something similar the first time you block to avoid any color transfer, just like those cool dark wash jeans. Always hand wash in cool and lay flat to dry

Alterations suggestions:

If you have wider hands add 2 extra SC rows at the end of the pattern

Let's start your gloves:



make a slip knot and make a chain with 18 links to start

SC into each of these 18 chains

Body of gloves:

row 1 Ch 3 to make a tail on the 18 chains and then TP all the way across 18 times

row 2 ch 2 to make tail and then DC all the way across 18 times.

rows 3-6 repeat row 1 and 2

row 7 SC across

Finishing:

Fold the gloves in half long ways and sew up the size with a darning needle leaving 2 inches open at the top

sew down from the top approx half and inch leaving a hole in the middle for your thumb. You can adjust where the thumb hole is to either cover your fingers for arm more.

weave in the loose ends and then turn the gloves inside out so that the woven in ends are on the inside.
